### **Readathon 2018**

Readathon is a sponsored reading event; it provides a stimulating focus for recreational reading and raises money for seriously ill children. Since the launch of Lagan College's first Readathon thirteen years ago, Lagan College pupils have raised more than **£45,000**. As the National Literary Trust states: *"Reading for pleasure has been revealed as the most important indicator of the future success of a child."*

### **The Charity**

The money raised this year is donated to: **Read for Good**. Lagan College pupils were encouraged to read for pleasure in order to help children in their community. The money raised means that children in all of the UK's major children's hospitals (including The Royal Victoria Hospital for Sick Children, Belfast) get much-needed brand new books and regular visits from professional storytellers.

For children in hospital, books and stories are particularly important – they comfort, distract, reassure and entertain. Read for Good provides a regular supply of brand new books along with storyteller visits to brighten up the days of children. Children unable to leave their beds can choose books from our specially designed mobile bookcase which wheels right up to their bedside. Because they are brand new, the books are safe for those at high risk of infection.

### **Lagan's Readathon**

**For the thirteenth year running**, Lagan College pupils eagerly participated in the Readathon challenge, even participating in 'Extreme Reading'! Year 8 pupils were excused from regular English lessons, in favour of reading. The pupils read books and got sponsored to do it! During the week many friends and family members were 'hit' for sponsorship money. Combining a love of reading with raising money for charity proved extremely beneficial this year: for the English Department, Readathon is not just about raising money, it's about raising readers! Michael Rosen, Children's Laureate states: *The world's wisdom is in books. Get children excited in books and then they'll get the world's wisdom."*

### **Achievements and Awards**

In a Special Awards Assembly, prizes were presented to those who raised the most money. Some individuals made outstanding contributions: **Jessica Elwood** of 8i raised an impressive **£85** and **Corban Allen** of 8N raised an amazing **£165**. Special mention goes to **Charlie McCourt** of 8L for raising the highest individual amount with a staggering **£200**. Our current record holder, **Laura Mills** 13DNT, who individually raised £310 for Readathon, was delighted to present Charlie with his prize.

contribution would continue funding professional storytellers and brand new books for very sick children. We were all incredibly moved by his account of Kevin, a terminally ill child, whose final request was to hear a story. We were also highly entertained by Steve's didgeridoo playing accompanied by Year 8 volunteer musicians, including Kaidan Butler on drums! Steve was overwhelmed with the magnificent amount Lagan pupils had raised - **£3809.79** and congratulated us warmly. Over the last thirteen years, pupils at Lagan College have raised over **£45,000** via Readathon – a fabulous achievement!

The charity supports very sick children and without them there would be more very miserable children in the world. In the words of Michael Rosen, Children's Laureate, *"If you read, the world is yours!"* All pupils who took part in Readathon should be very proud of themselves – you have created an immense challenge for next year!

## Sailing the Seas

### Sea Cadets National Drill & Piping Competition HMS Raleigh, Portsmouth 2018

I first joined the Belfast Eagle Unit of the Sea Cadets as a Junior when I was 11. Once I turned 12, I moved up into the Senior Section. I normally attend twice a week, on Monday's and Thursday's. However, when a National Competition is approaching and the selection process starts for the Northern Ireland team the commitment levels rise considerably.

This year's Drill & Piping Nationals took place over the weekend of 20<sup>th</sup> – 22<sup>nd</sup> April at HMS Raleigh in Portsmouth, but the selection for the Northern Ireland team started 6 weeks previously. This was a big commitment as we would meet at HMS Hibernia in Lisburn every Saturday and Sunday from 9am to 5pm each day. The weekends felt very long and usually I just came home, had some dinner and headed straight to bed as I was exhausted. But it had to be done if you wanted to be considered.

As I was selected as part of a 3 person NI piping team the previous year for the first time, I put myself forward for selection again this year. Thankfully as the end of the 6 weeks I was selected again to represent Northern Ireland.

For the weekend itself, we had to leave Belfast on the Thursday night, travel down to Dublin to board a ferry to Wales, where we then began our long bus journey to Portsmouth. As soon as the competition was finished on the Saturday we only got a few hours to enjoy ourselves at the awards and after disco, then it's straight back on the bus to start the journey home again. But it is definitely worth it as it is a very enjoyable weekend.

I am very happy to report that for the second year running I was awarded a silver medal as the second best individual piper in the UK going up against many cadets from all over the UK. Also, as a bonus, our Northern Ireland piping team came home with an overall bronze medal.

As a Cadet I am kept very busy not only on Unit nights, but during the summer months comes boating season, when we are out on rowing boats, sailing boats, motor boats and kayaks. When naval ships visit Belfast from many nations we usually get an invite. We usually help out at the Maritime Festivals. Last year I attended residential courses across Northern Ireland and was selected for National Competitions in both London (Kayaking) and Portsmouth. I also went to summer camps in both Scotland and Gibraltar! Finally this summer, I am booked to attend my first off shore training on a boat around the coast of Scotland. As you can see, I am kept very busy with the Sea Cadets and I would recommend the experience to anyone.
