Mayor celebrates 40 years of Integrated Education

Mayor of Lisburn & Castlereagh City Council, Alderman Stephen Martin, welcomed Lagan College and other pupils and staff from integrated schools to celebrate 40 years of integrated education in Northern Ireland. It was a great night of music and entertainment with special performances from Fort Hill Integrated College, Fort Hill Integrated Primary School and Millennium Integrated Primary School.

Mayor Martin said in his address on Tuesday 15th March, "It is amazing to think that in September 1981, Lagan College became Northern Ireland's first integrated school with just 28 students. 40 years later, this has grown from 28 students to more than 25,000 with almost 70 integrated schools spread right across the province."

Speaking after the event, Mrs McNamee MBE said: "We wish to thank the Mayor, Alderman Stephen Martin and Lisburn and Castlereagh Council for hosting a wonderful event to celebrate 40 years of integrated education with the six integrated schools within the council area. We truly hope in the future we will see more parents having the choice to send their children to an integrated school and that more children will have the chance of growing up, learning and making friends with others from different cultures, backgrounds, political opinions, faiths and none, ethnicities, other genders and family units. We hope to see as many young people in NI from all schools being peace makers and leaders taking us into a positive shared future."



IFA Football Gold Award

The Peer Education Programme was a 5-week programme delivered by Sixth Form students to our Years 8s devised by the Mental Health Foundation.

Lesson 1 discussed how we all have mental health and that it can change, often depending on circumstances in our lives. Lesson 2 focused on why mental health problems happen and dispelled some of the myths associated with it. In Lesson 3 they learnt how to stay well, looking at tips for protecting and improving our mental health and why mental health problems happen. Looking after yourself was the topic of Lesson 4 and how we may need different supports with maintaining good mental health and identifying sources of support. Lesson 5 allowed the Year 8s to learn about looking after each other, what support friends can offer us and how to help friends look after their mental health. Thank you to Mrs Grant for coordinating such a wonderful and invaluable programme for our Year 8s which we hope will help them as they learn how to handle and help each other with their mental health.



Visit by the President of Methodist Church

I sensed strongly that Lagan College holds firmly to the vision of its founders, to promote a collaborative, inclusive approach to education across all cultural and religious traditions, while being respectful of difference."



"During my visit I engaged with the principal, and others, about the recently passed Integrated Education Bill, and in particular expressed the strong commitment of the churches to remain as active participants in the education of all our children, across all sectors. The Christian ethos of Lagan College is a crucial part of the entire school experience, and I was impressed with the many evident signs of this, which I was shown during my visit. I was invited to conduct a short act of worship and reflection in the chaplaincy as our meetings with staff and pupils came to a conclusion. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mrs McNamee and her staff team for their kind welcome, and wish Lagan College every success for its next 40 years and beyond."





We now have red boxes filled with products placed in every girl's/single occupancy bathroom, and there are more girls involved now than ever. Now that the original Red Box Project team are leaving Lagan, a new team of girls have volunteered to take on the role of ensuring no young person has to miss their education due to a period.




Year 8 Nest Collages
